



Crochet Washcloth

Materials:

- ❖ Skein of worsted weight cotton yarn (I used Sugar and Cream in Hot Pink)
- ❖ Accent color in worsted weight cotton yarn (I used left over Sugar and Cream in White)
- ❖ G/6 - 4.00 MM hook
- ❖ Scissors
- ❖ Tapestry Needle

Abbreviations:

- ❖ CH = chain
- ❖ DC = double crochet
- ❖ FPT = front post treble

Special Note: I am not exactly sure of the amount of yarn I used for my edging. It honestly depends on how intricate you want to make it! For the bulk of the cloth, I did use almost an entire skein of the Sugar and Cream (2.5oz/70.9g) so this pattern is generous in size and can always be tailored to your preference. Estimated time is dependent on your individual speed and I have added a few pictures for visual help (after pattern instructions). If you have any questions please contact me at:

Pattern:

- 1) CH 42
- 2) In third CH from hook, 1 DC into CH and 1 DC into each CH until the end. CH 2 and turn.
- 3) In next stitch *1 Dc then in next stitch 1 FPT. Repeat from * until end. In the very first DC, 1 DC into the opening. CH 2 and turn.
- 4) In next stitch *1 FPT then in next stitch 1 DC. Repeat from * until end. In the very last space DC into opening. CH 2 and turn.
- 5) Step 3 and 4 are going to be repeated until you have reached a total of 19 rows, or until you have reached your desired shape.

Edging:

Start edging in top of last DC or anywhere you feel comfortable. I like the simplistic look of a half double crochet, however a scalloped edge would look lovely and oh so romantic! The sky is the limit with your preferred edging choice so have some fun with it!

Quick Picture Tutorial



Step 1: CH 42



Step 2: DC in third chain and each remaining chain until end CH 2 and turn



Step 3: DC in next stitch NOT in the very first stitch. Your CH2 accounts for that stitch.



Then FPT (right side of work) in next stitch. Repeat pattern until end.



Step 3 cont'd.: At the end of the row, DC into the little loop created by the first DC (the 2 chains that were skipped in Step 2 when placing the first DC in the 3rd chain from hook)



Pattern after 3 rows!
